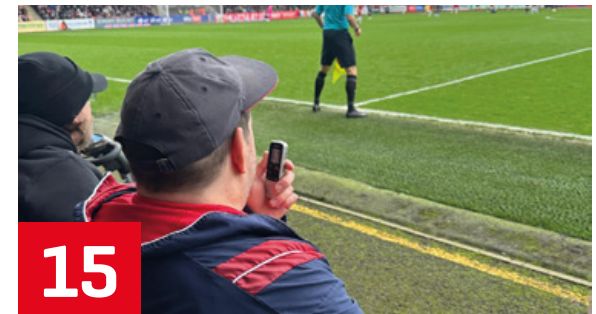

Good afternoon Robins fans and welcome back to the Completely-Suzuki Stadium ahead of another big week of Sky Bet League One action beginning with the visit of Burton Albion. I'd like to welcome the fans, staff and players from Burton to Cheltenham for today's game.

Tuesday night's 2-0 defeat at Wycombe was a performance that was nowhere near the standard we've set ourselves over a period of time. The players are disappointed and are aware that the levels weren't near those needed to win a game in League One.

It wasn't for a lack of effort though. A lot of our decision making was wrong and when you combine that with players not performing to the required levels, you won't pick up points at this level. It's a defeat we have to learn from and I have analysed my own performance as have the players and we've picked the bones out of it ahead of another important week in our season.

Whilst we didn't perform to the levels required, I haven't been too harsh on the group. We've picked up 10 points from our last five games including those three consecutive wins and now we've got two home games coming up where we will be looking for a response once again.

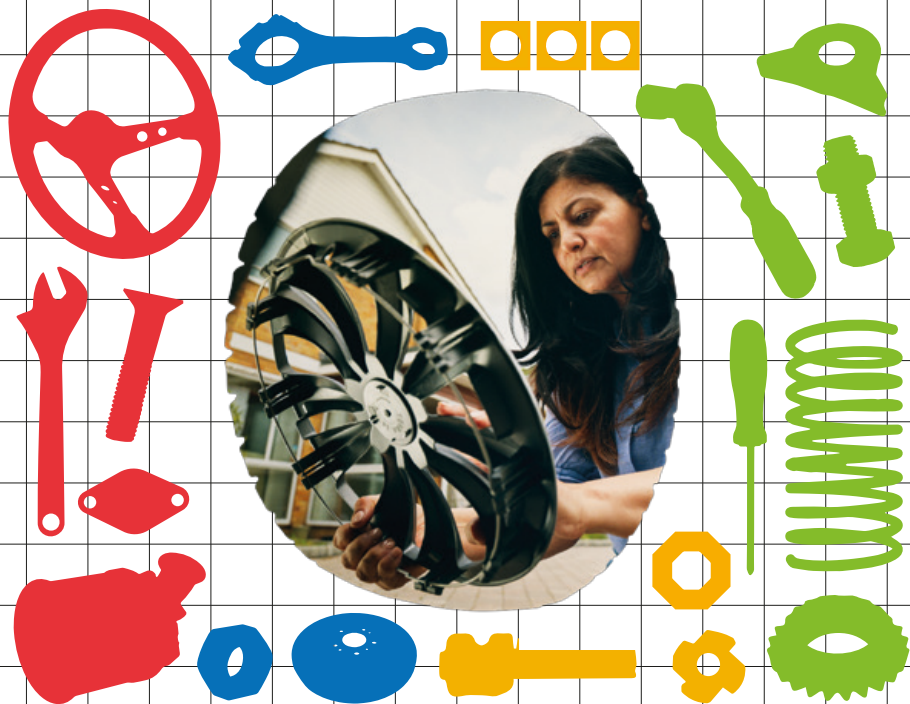

CHAIRMAN DAVID BLOXHAM

A very warm welcome to the Completely-Suzuki Stadium to the fans, directors, players and staff of Burton Albion for this afternoon's League One fixture.

Surprisingly, with almost three quarters of the season's fixture's played, this is the first league match of the season between the two clubs due to postponements of previous scheduled dates. Our reverse game against the Brewers is now set to take place on Tuesday the 16th April.

We are now into the "business end" of the season when the competition for promotion at the top half of the league and fight against relegation within the bottom half becomes even more intense. The pressures can sometimes give rise to surprising results as teams battle to achieve their objectives. I am sure today's fixture will be a keenly contested and close game.

This week has seen the publication of the annual accounts of many league clubs for the season 2022-23 including our own accounts which show a sizeable loss. This is of course a matter of concern as we cannot, as a club, sustain such a loss year on year. The club have issued a media statement providing an explanation for the loss which I would encourage fans to read on the club's website.

Although the previous seasons loss is a concern which we must and are addressing it follows two profitable seasons. Taken together over the past three

seasons it is, I believe, fair to say that the Club has performed well above its financial resources and with overall financial prudence. If we also compare ourselves with the financial position of a number of other league Clubs who return significantly higher losses year on year we should be justifiably pleased.

The financial pressure of maintaining sustainable League One football is considerable. Wages and other overheads rise year on year as clubs compete for the best players whilst at the same time attempting to maintain and improve their stadiums and training facilities. I appreciate that it is hard to accept, as a fan, that certain income, such as the sale of a player, cannot always be fully reinvested in a replacement player. The reality is that such income often must be applied toward paying other unavoidable costs.

February has been a positive month for us on the pitch with three wins, two defeats

and a draw. In order to climb up the league table it will be necessary for us to sustain that form during March and April. I know that Darrell and all his staff and players are working remarkably hard and will be doing their very best to win the points we need.

As always, I cannot over emphasise or thank you enough for the role that you, our fans, can, do and must continue to play in supporting the team for our remaining league fixtures. In addition to giving your maximum vocal support today please continue to do the same at all our remaining games both home and, when possible, away. Your attendance and positive support makes a huge difference in creating a winning environment. If we all continue to work hard and support the team we can again succeed against the financial odds!

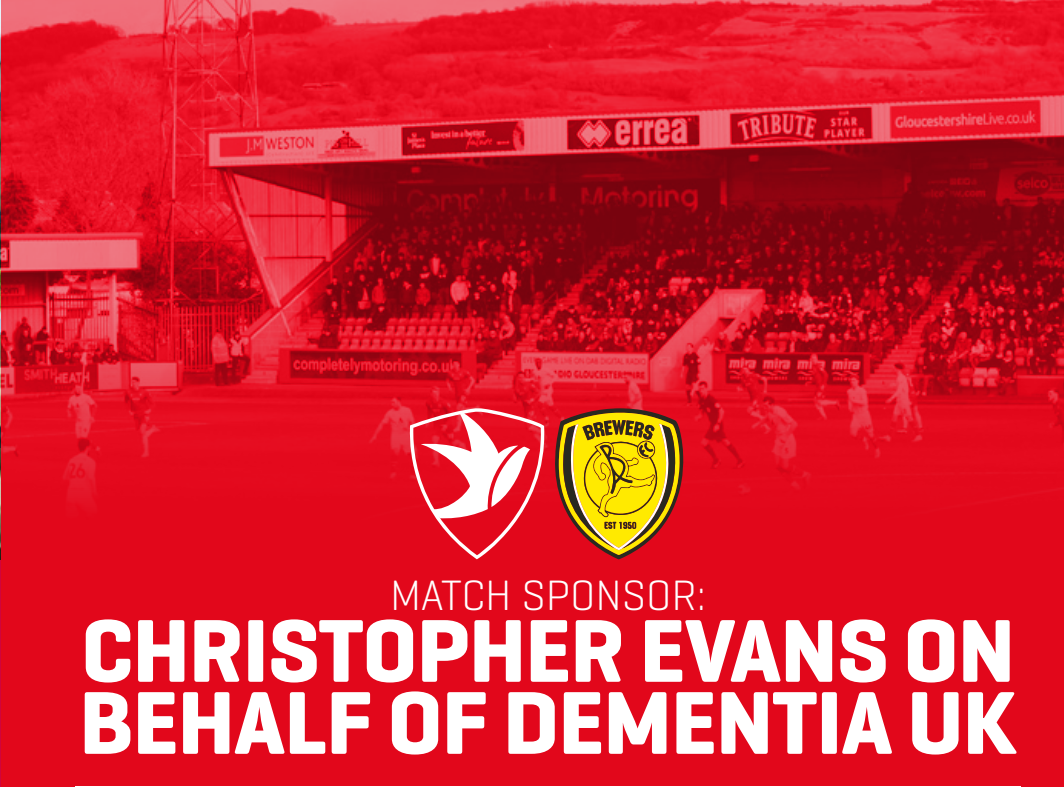

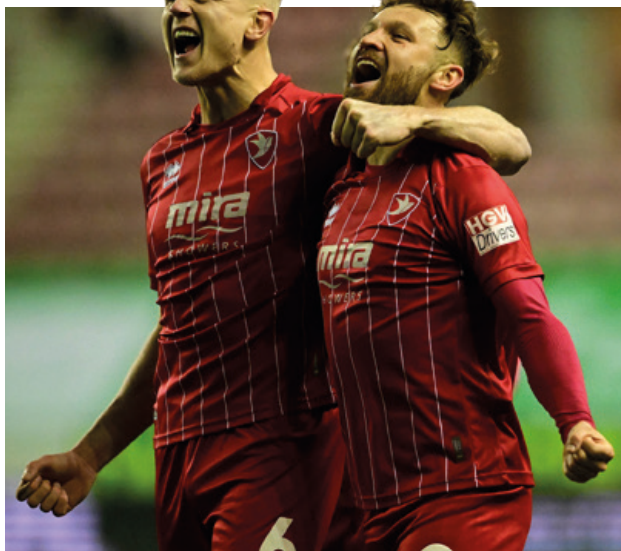

Robins supporter Adam Collings regularly watches home matches from the Colin Farmer Stand sponsored by JM Weston Construction, he loves commentating on the game each week using his Dictaphone.

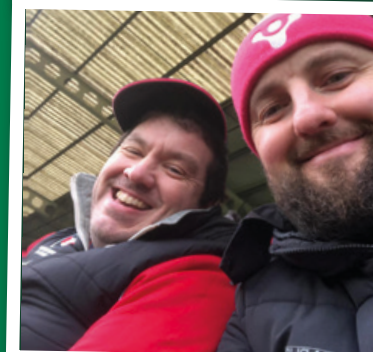
Leckhampton, he quickly became a Cheltenham Town fan, and from then on, there was no other team for him.

His family and various helpers would take him to the ground, so he could get to as many home matches as possible. Sadly, Adam's mother passed away when he was just 16 years old, and his dad, Richard, passed away unexpectedly in December 2019.

When Adam was seven months old, he was in the hospital for a lengthy spell due to a delay in his birth where he suffered breathing problems.

This left him in intensive care for six weeks with his family not knowing whether he'd survive, and if so, whether he'd walk or suffer severe brain damage.

When his aunty and now guardian, Shirley, phones him to see how the Robins did, he'll never say they lost. He instead says, "They nearly won."



This made his mother, Linda, push the best physio/cranial therapist and assistance she could find. Adam then started going to St. Roses Disabled School in Stroud to give him independence. He gained many friends there and had an active social life.

Two years ago, Shirley sought the help of the Robins Trust to help Adam attend home matches, and Gavin Garthwaite kindly offered to help. They now watch the games together each week - keep up the good work Adam and thanks for your support!

JORDAN THOMAS

Making a rapid rise up the footballing pyramid is the attack minded youngster Jordan Thomas who is keen to not be fazed by his new challenge.

Relief was the overwhelming feeling for the young ace upon putting pen to paper for the Robins on late on Deadline Day of the January transfer window.

“There was a lot of waiting around and I hadn’t done any of that before so I was glad when it was done and dusted,” said Thomas about joining the club.

His journey is a unique one compared to your standard Football League player having spent time at Didcot Town, North Leigh and most recently Bath City before signing for Town.

And it is those steps that he has taken that he believes stands him in good stead for his move up three leagues into the EFL.

“My story is probably a bit different to what other people have had, especially at this level but it has all been part of my journey,” added Thomas.

“I never played academy

football when I was in youth football so I’ve always had that drive to play as high as I possibly can and going through the ranks of non-league, it’s probably a story not many can say they’ve had.

“I’m happy I’ve gone through that and I’m always motivated to go higher and higher and I think that’s the difference between me and some players.”

During his time with the Romans this season he netted 10 times whilst playing under former Robins defender Jerry Gill.

“I preferred it over where I played previously at North Leigh because you get more respect when you’re playing higher up and I feel like my technical ability has never been a problem so I’ve always impressed on that side of it.

“I feel like I’ve improved in my physique and been able to push on and impress at that level

even though I’ve never played there before.”

Manager Darrell Clarke will be hoping his rich vein of form in front of goal, that also saw him score 32 times across two seasons for North Leigh, continues in the Robins’ survival fight and Thomas has been enamoured by the gaffer.

“He’s down to earth and everything has been really positive so far. He’s had a fair amount of success so it’s really exciting now to get going in full time football.”

The winger signed on a two-and-a-half-year deal and has made a couple of appearances off the bench since signing and is desperate to help the team in whatever way he can.

“Hopefully I can help get the team and contribute with my performances and maybe get a goal or two or an assist. We’ve got a big end to the season and it’s one I’m looking forward to.”

Burton Albion are facing a fight to extend their six season stay in League One but under new manager Martin Paterson there is renewed hope amongst the Brewers fanbase.

The Staffordshire based club were only founded in 1950 and completed their rise up the English footballing ladder and into the Football League after Nigel Clough led them to the Conference title in the 2008/09 season. The Brewers didn't stop there with a League Two title in 2015 and promotion from League One the next season. Two seasons in the Championship followed before they returned to the third where they have become a regular resident.

Fast forward to the current campaign and Albion occupy 17th spot in League One with a five point buffer between themselves and the relegation zone. The assistant manager of former Robins player and manager Michael Duff at Barnsley and Swansea City, Paterson took over at the helm from Dino Maamria in January and has picked up three wins from his opening eight games including a pair of 2-1 successes on the road against Bristol Rovers and Leyton Orient.

A stumble at the Pirelli Stadium against Carlisle United has kept today's

opponents Cheltenham Town within touching distance, a side they are yet to play in 2023/24 after the reverse fixture has been postponed on three separate occasions. The Robins are also a side they haven't lost competitively against since November 2012 and picked up a point in a 0-0 draw against then Wade Elliott's side at the Completely-Suzuki Stadium back in April.

The 2018/19 EFL Cup semi-finalists have had to deal with the significant blow of Blackpool loanee Beryly Lubala being recalled during January after he scored six goals for the Brewers in the first half of the season.

And it's goals that have generally been hard to come by for the fifth lowest goal scorers in League One and they'll be hoping January addition Joe Huggill from Manchester United is the solution after scoring on his debut against Derby County in Paterson's first game.

They do have the second best defensive record of the sides in the bottom half of the table however with goalkeeper Max Crocombe and defenders Ryan Sweeney and John Brayford forming a strong core in the backline.

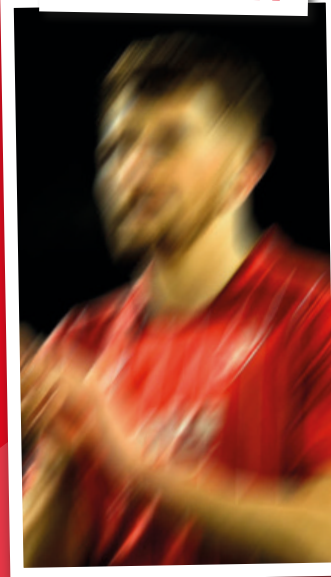

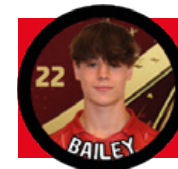

In 2021, a group of passionate women fans felt mobilised to start a campaign called #HerGameToo.

The campaign is committed to fostering an ethos in football where women are welcomed and respected equally and can be confident sharing their opinions about football online and in person without fear of sexist abuse. This afternoon, we introduce two new advocates to the cause.

Cheltenham Town's Her Game Too ambassador, Kelly-Marie Selby, tells us: "Growing up loving football, it was so sad that not only did girls not have the opportunities that boys had to further their abilities, but trying to voice my opinion was almost impossible. As soon as I tried to express any views I was told I was a girl, I didn't know anything about football, and I should just concentrate on make up and being a girl.

"The younger me shied away from fighting, but as I got older, I knew this wasn't right and that I should be allowed to join in on conversations about football. So when the opportunity came to become an ambassador of an amazing campaign to empower women to have a voice without fear, I put myself forward. Over the past few months I've been ambassador for Her Game Too Cheltenham, and this has now grown

with three incredible ladies coming on board - Mary Stone, Taz Scoles and Emily Moore.

"Together, we want to help create an environment at The Completely-Suzuki Stadium where women of all ages can feel welcome and safe without fear of sexism and misogyny, knowing there are avenues to report such incidents."

Introducing themselves, Taz explained: "53 years ago the ban of woman playing football was finally lifted, and now we are seeing woman on the big screens influencing the new generation. Her Game Too brings awareness to the struggles woman players and fans may face and how we can eliminate it. I am so excited to work alongside Her Game Too to raise more awareness and inspire the younger generations."

Alongside Taz and Kelly-Marie, Mary reflected on what the campaign is for her: "Her Game Too means being able to go and watch football games wherever I want, whenever I want,



without being made uncomfortable. In the short space of time I've been involved with this group, I've connected with so many female football friends, like Kelly and Taz, and sharing our experiences together shows exactly why we're doing what we're doing.

"I'd encourage everyone to find a way to get involved with Her Game Too, it could be through doing something so simple as wearing our badge or taking a more front facing role in tackling sexism in football."
